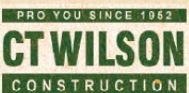

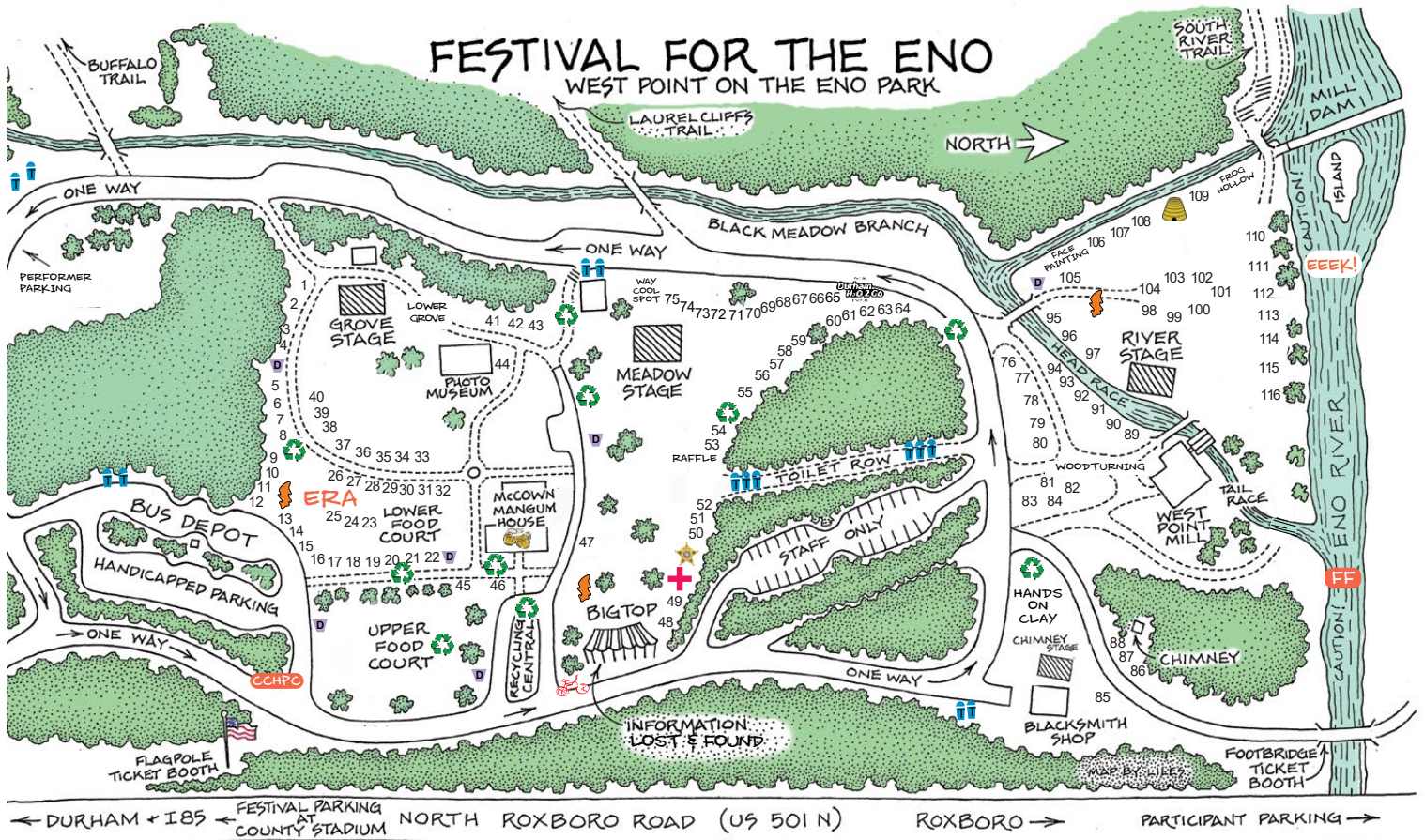

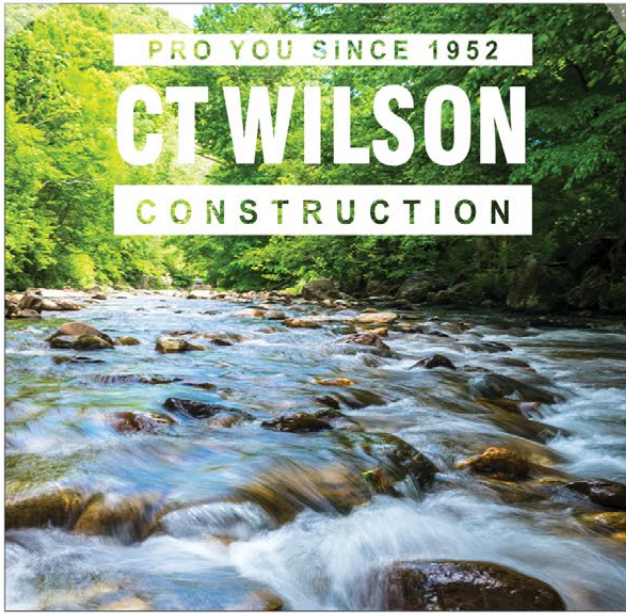

BEAT THE HEAT FESTIVAL SAFETY TIPS

STAY HYDRATED

Drink water throughout the day to replace fluid lost to sweat. Don't wait for extreme thirst to drink.

TIP: Fill up your water bottle at a free H2O2Go station or visit a drink tent.



Seek shade under a tree or umbrella.

Avoid staying in the sun for extended periods.

KNOW THE SIGNS OF HEAT-RELATED ILLNESS

- Heavy sweating
- Cold, pale, clammy skin
- Fast, weak pulse
- Nausea or vomiting
- Muscle cramps
- Tiredness, dizziness, headache
- Fainting

TAKE CARE

Check on your friends & family. People at greater risk include elders, infants, children, pregnant people, & people with health conditions or certain medications.

WHAT TO DO

- Move to a cool place
- Loosen clothing
- Sip water slowly
- Cool down with wet cloths

STAY COOL

Visit the mist tent or take a dip in the Eno to cool off! Go to the ERA tent or EEEK! by the river if you need help finding them.

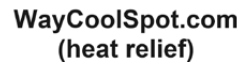
